2023 Legislative Agenda - Critical Priority:

Advocate and monitor any legislation or regulations related to motorcycles concerning connected and autonomous vehicles (AV):

Endorse rulemaking to set new standards specific to seeing, detecting, and properly reacting to motorcycles.

Ensure motorcycles are part of all testing and development procedures.

Promote that any AV public user advisory committees should include a representative from the motorcycle community and a motorcycle manufacturer.

Require a public, easily accessible, and searchable database where consumers can look up important safety information such as the limitations and capabilities of different products offered by AV manufacturers or service providers.

Require that all AV manufacturers submit safety evaluation reports to detail and make public how their vehicles identify motorcycles among other road users. Manufacturers must also include human error analysis in safety reports.

Require that all AV manufacturers publicly report crash data share incidents between AVs and motorcycles just as they would incidents between AVs and other road users.

Protect the safety of motorcyclists with any rules or standards as it relates to electronic and cybersecurity systems including the clarification of rights of data ownership of any recorded data in the context of connected and autonomous vehicles.

Inclusion of motorcyclists' perspectives in discussions regarding the Intelligent Transportation System (ITS).

Work to ensure motorcycles are a separate classification of vehicle and road user for purposes of regulation and testing of AVs.

Protect the set aside radio spectrums necessary for DSRC vehicle to vehicle communications.

Protect additional spectrum as needed for Vehicle to Everything technology! (V2X)

2022 Motorcycle Riders Foundation Legislative Champions Representative Susie Lee of Nevada and Representative Mike Gallagher of Wisconsin were recently honored as the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) 2022 Legislators of the Year. With bikers from around the country gathering in Washington, D.C. for Bikers Inside the Beltway, it was a great chance to thank our 2022 award winners.

Representative Lee was instrumental in seeking answers from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration on the profiling of bikers. Representative Gallagher was the lead sponsor of the Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) bill which was included in a larger transportation bill that officially reestablished the MAC. Both items championed by these two lawmakers are key parts of the MRF legislative agenda. Each lawmaker was presented with a customized leather vest and now joins an exclusive list of past MRF legislators of the year

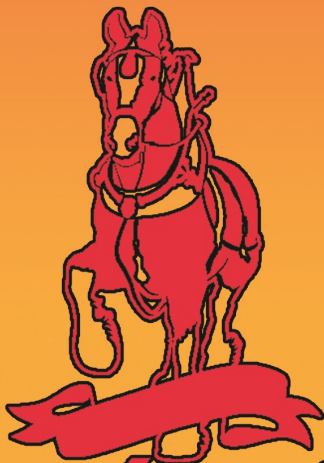



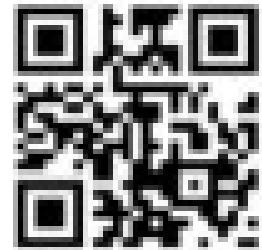

5/18/2023 - House Concurs

Comments: Amended bill creates a Zero Traffic Fatality Task Force. 2nd Amendment to the bill puts a motorcycle organization on the task force. **Report Position:** Support **State Bill Page:** [HB2131](#)

HB1108 VEH CD-STREET NOISE MONITORING (CROKE M) Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that the City of Chicago shall (instead of "may") enact an ordinance providing for a noise monitoring system upon any portion of the roadway known as Jean-Baptiste Pointe DuSable Lake Shore Drive. Requires that the installation of the noise monitoring system should be completed within 6 months after the effective date of the amendatory Act. Requires that, 12 months after the effective date of the amendatory Act, and any time after the first report as the City deems necessary, the City of Chicago shall prepare a noise monitoring report with the data collected from the system and, upon request, shall make the report available to the public. Limits home rule powers.

Comments: Creates a noise monitoring program on Lake Shore Drive. Could Possibly lead to motorcycles being targeted by automated and unreliable enforcement.

HB2131 **VEH CD-25MPH LIMIT NEAR BIKES (HUYNH H)** House Committee Amendment No. 1 - Replaces everything after the enacting clause. Amends the Department of Transportation Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Requires the Secretary of Transportation to establish and convene the Zero Traffic Fatalities Task Force to develop a structured, coordinated process for early engagement of all parties to develop policies to reduce traffic fatalities to zero. Provides that the Task Force shall include, but is not limited to, representatives from the Illinois State Police, State-supported institutions of higher learning, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Public Health, local governments, bicycle safety organizations, statewide motorist service membership organizations, transportation advocacy organizations, and labor organizations. Requires the Secretary of Transportation to prepare and submit a report of findings based on the Zero Traffic Fatalities Task Force's efforts to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 2025. Sets forth issues that shall be included in the report. Provides for repeal of the provisions on January 1, 2026. Effective immediately.

House Floor Amendment No. 2 - Provides that representatives from the Secretary of State and motorcycle safety organizations shall be included in the Zero Traffic Fatalities Task Force.

Senate Committee Amendment No. 1 - Changes the members of the Task Force to the following: (i) the Secretary of Transportation, or the Secretary's designee, who shall serve as Chair of the Task Force; (ii) the Director of State Police, or the Director's designee; (iii) the Secretary of State, or the Secretary's designee; (iv) the Director of Public Health, or the Director's designee; (v) a member from 3 different public universities in this State, appointed by the Governor; (vi) a representative of a statewide motorcycle safety organization, appointed by the Governor; (vii)) a representative of a statewide motorist service membership organization, appointed by the Governor; (viii) a representative of a statewide transportation advocacy organization, appointed by the Governor; (ix) a representative of a bicycle safety organization, appointed by the Governor; (x) a representative of a statewide organization representing municipalities, appointed by the Governor; and (xi) a representative of a statewide labor organization, appointed by the Governor.

HB1634 **VEH CD-CALI EMISSION STANDARDS (GONZALEZ JR. E)** Amends the Vehicle Emissions Inspection Law of 2005 of the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that, by December 1, 2023, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency shall adopt rules to implement the motor vehicle emission standards of the State of California, including, but not limited to the (1) zero-emission vehicle program, (2) low-emission vehicle program, (3) advanced clean trucks program, and (4) heavy-duty low NOx omnibus program, and shall amend the rules within 6 months of any changes to maintain consistency with the California motor vehicle emission standards and federal clean air laws. Provides that the rules may incorporate by reference the California motor vehicle standards established in final regulations issued by the California Air Resources Board and promulgated under the California Health and Safety Code. Effective immediately.

HB2053 AUTONOMOUS VEH REQUIREMENTS (KIFOWIT S) Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Defines "autonomous vehicle" as a motor vehicle that possesses the capability (enabled or not) for automated functions to control movement of the vehicle along 2 axes of direction simultaneously. Provides that, before selling or continuing to operate a new or used autonomous vehicle in this State and before updating the software or hardware of any automated driving system on such a vehicle, a manufacturer shall submit to the Department of Transportation documentation regarding the level of driving automation, along with a filing fee in an amount to be determined by the Department. Provides that the Department shall assemble an Automated Driving Systems Review Committee to evaluate submitted documentation and make determinations concerning the level of automated driving capabilities and the suitability of the vehicle for operation on public roads. Provides that an autonomous vehicle classified as having Level 2 Driving Automation may be sold to consumers and registered for use. Provides that the owner of the automated vehicle shall file an annual report with the Department of Transportation stating the number of miles driven per year, the estimated number of miles driven using equipped automated driving systems, and any collisions that occurred involving the vehicle. Prohibits the sale or operation of autonomous vehicles classified as having Level 3, 4, or 5 Driving Automation. Provides that a resident may file a request for the Automated Driving Systems Review Committee to review an existing vehicle sold or registered in this State, and that the Secretary of State shall receive and investigate complaints of a dealer selling a vehicle prohibited for sale under the new provisions. Provides that a person who operates a prohibited vehicle is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor and that such a vehicle is subject to impoundment. Provides penalties for the unauthorized sale or modification of an autonomous vehicle.

HB2582 VEH CD-TEST EXEMPTION UNDER 18 (FRITTS B) Amends Illinois Vehicle Code. Removes the testing requirement for motorcycle operators who are under the age of 18. Current Status:

6/30/2023 - Public Act 103-0162
Recent Status: 6/30/2023 - Effective Date January 1, 2024

6/30/2023 - GOVERNOR APPROVED Comments: This bill eliminates the duplicate motorcycle testing requirement for 16-17 yrs. olds. This bill still requires 16-17 yr. olds to attend and successfully complete a MSF Basic Rider Course which includes the standard SOS riding test as part of its curriculum and is a higher standard than what is placed on potential riders 18+ in age. It eliminates the requirement to test a 2nd time at a SOS facility.

There are things you can learn in a class and then some you can read in a book. However the lessons you learn the Hard Way, seem to stick with you.

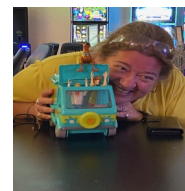

Safety & Education.....

5 tips to riding safe in the summer heat:

Stay hydrated. You're going to sweat a lot riding on a hot summer day, especially if you're wearing a lot of riding gear. Since sweat can evaporate quickly while you're riding, the amount that you're sweating may be less noticeable and can lead to heat exhaustion and dehydration very quickly. Drink a lot of water to stay hydrated. It's best to bring more water with you than you think you'll need and even bring a few frozen water bottles to help keep cool. Don't forget to not only hydrate but also replace electrolytes.

Avoid riding if you're tired. If you're tired before you plan to ride, then it's not a good idea to get on your bike. The heat will make you even more exhausted and you won't be able to properly focus on your surroundings. Avoiding energy drinks is a good idea as well, since you'll eventually be tired again after drinking them and they can add to dehydration.

Use the right gear. Dehydration and exhaustion aren't the only ways you can be injured in the heat. Intense heat is usually accompanied by intense sunlight that can cause extreme sunburn in a few minutes. Using the proper riding gear will help keep you covered from the sun and safe in the event of a crash. Cooling gear can help you beat the heat on a sweltering day. If you choose to ride without gear or a helmet, make sure that you're wearing sunscreen of 30 SPF or more.

Remember to rest. Long rides can be exhausting, even without extreme heat. In warm temperatures, plan to take more rest breaks at various stops along your ride, so you can sit in the shade or in an air-conditioned location. Being in top shape for riding will make sure you are able to give your full attention to the road and have a safe ride.

Note melting roads/parking lots. Asphalt melts in hot temperatures, making newer roads soft and affecting the handling of your bike. Drive with caution on roads that may be affected by the heat. Even parking your bike on asphalt could be hazardous. A kickstand can sink into hot asphalt in parking lots or on roads, making your bike vulnerable to tipping over. Using a kickstand puck can help keep your bike upright.

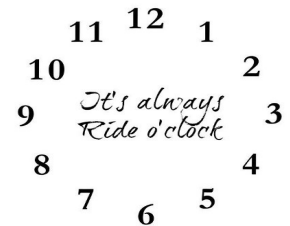
